### Ask DeAnna

Dear DeAnna,

My 13-year-old is experiencing some pretty dramatic mood swings and big emotions these days. She has mentioned not being sure why she feels sad or angry and says she doesn't know how to deal with these extreme feelings. She also has pretty low self-worth despite being an amazing kiddo. I know hormones play a huge role in a kid's emotions at this age, but should we be concerned? I don't have the tools in my toolbox to walk her through these times, and we often end up frustrated and upset when we try to talk. My question is, do you think therapy is warranted so she can have an unbiased person's perspective and guidance?

Dear Worried Mama,

First, BRAVA, for reaching out! Many of us believe that we should naturally know how to handle these difficult situations that arise with our children. My main mission is to remove the stigma around seeking help for mental and emotional health issues.

When it comes to teenagers, there are many

factors at play, and I am absolutely certain that none of us handle it perfectly. Let's start with HORMONES; your teenager is going through something that greatly affects her mood, and she has no control over it, nor does she have any prior experience dealing with it. This is a new experience for both her and you.

Another important issue is that she's at an age where she wants to be independent like an adult but still looks up to you for solutions to all her problems. I often advise parents in this situation to shift from being a parent to becoming more of a coach, offer fewer suggestions, and wait for their teenager to ask for help before stepping in. It's a challenging change that requires practice.

When my own teenager started therapy, I confided in a trusted friend about feeling embarrassed as a therapist myself because my child needed treatment. Her response was comforting: "All teenagers need therapy." It brought me immense relief.

I suggest gently asking your teenager if she would like to speak with a professional. If she shows interest, proceed further; if not, let her know it's always an option if she changes her mind. By treating it as a normal and healthy choice, she might see it the same way. Remember, though, it may take time for her to decide, so try not to have any expectations when discussing this topic.

The National Cemeteries closest to Orange County are Miramar National Cemetery in San Diego and Riverside National Cemetery. ### The Storied Lives of Donna and Ken Friess

hen telling the story of Donna and Ken Friess, it takes work to pinpoint just where to begin. Their chapters span multiple decades and are bursting with love, family, adventure, history, service to the community, and more. They have been fixtures in the San Juan community for 50 years, and their connection to the area is deeply rooted. As with most tales, the logical place to start is the beginning.

Donna fondly reflects, "When we were 14, Ken and I met through his Boy Scout leader. Ken, wanting to appear older and more sophisticated, said he was 15. When I spotted him through the glass-paned door of the Scout leader's home, I was so stricken that I could not eat or sleep for the remainder of our five-day visit. I've never gotten over it. It was truly love at first sight."

At the time, Donna lived in Venice and Ken in Palos Verdes, so dating wasn't a logical option. Instead, an epic and romantic years-long letter-writing connection ensued. Their love would blossom through written correspondence until college.

Donna stayed in SoCal for her schooling, graduating cum laude from the University of Southern California, where she was a proud member of the Alpha Gama Delta sorority. She went on to earn a master's degree from Cal State Long Beach and her doctoral degree in psychology from Alliant University in San Diego. Ken attended Occidental College, earned his master's degree in psychology from Cal State Long Beach, and his doctoral degree in psychology at Alliant University.

Donna and Ken were married in 1964. Not long after, Donna took a position as a professor at Cypress College. A founding faculty member, she held the position for an impressive 44 years before her retirement in 2010. She adored teaching her communications students, and her students loved her. In 2009, she was named Orange County Teacher of the Year. Ken had a long, successful career as a general contractor before his focus shifted to a more civic-minded role.

In 1973, Donna and Ken moved their young family to an equestrian area in San Juan called Hidden Valley. Back then, the population of San Juan Capistrano was 7,000. Ken recalls, "There wasn't even a stop sign at San Juan Creek Road and La Novia! We lived on a dirt road with a septic tank and propane; the house was all electric. We couldn't even have a fireplace because the authorities deemed our house 'too far out in the country!" They fell in love with their two-acre property surrounded by rolling green hills and horse-conscious neighbors who quickly became dear friends.

As the town grew and the couple's fondness for the area bloomed, Ken applied to the Planning Commission. The city's original master plan was to build out the population to 85,000, which had Ken and several other like-minded community members concerned. The commission devised a new plan that capped the build-out at 39,000 to protect San Juan's ridgelines and open spaces. Their revised proposal was a success. The population of San Juan

currently sits right around 35,000. These early efforts preserved the integrity of the land and the rustic charm of the area, ensuring San Juan remained a precious and protected gem. Donna emphatically states, "We do not plan to ever move away. San Juan, Hidden Valley, is our home."

Inspired by his early involvement with the Planning Commission, Ken served four terms on the San Juan City Council and four terms as Mayor. He reflects, "During the 50 years we have lived in San Juan Capistrano, I have been amazed at the commitment of this community to work together to preserve our history, our open space, and our unique way of life."

Donna and Ken have three adult children; oldest son K. Erik "Rick" (married to Jenny Friess), Julina Bert (married to Justin Bert), and Dan Friess (married to Natalie Friess). They all have grown children of their own-11 kids between them, much to the delight of their grandparents. Rick is a land use litigating attorney for Allen Matkins Attorneys at Law, Dan owns his own development company, and Julina teaches middle school in North San Diego County.

Over the years, Ken kept his family active by introducing them to the sport of long-distance running. Ken has completed 18 marathons, and all three Friess children have run many races with their dad. One of the most harrowing was the Catalina 50K they all did together. Dan and Rick are Ironmen; Julina was an All-American athlete in college and has several marathons and races under her belt; Dan is an ultramarathoner; and Rick has run a whopping 120 marathons. Rick passed his love of running and competing down to his five girls, who have all completed at least one marathon.

Donna's hobbies are more artistic, philanthropic, and advocacyrelated. She has studied porcelain art under Millie Jones and is also a serious artist specializing in portraiture, recently choosing watercolor as her preferred medium. After she retired in 2010, she received the city's blessing to volunteer weekly as a grief counselor through the local recreation department. She held the hands and helped the hearts of group members for almost a decade before the pandemic shut down the program. She is also extremely passionate about her work as a Mission docent. Donna explains, "It is very important to me to share the history of San Juan and to celebrate the indigenous people who built our beautiful mission."

Additionally, she is an accomplished writer. Donna has authored ten books, perhaps the most well-known being Capistrano Trails:

Ride for the Brand, the equestrian story of Southern California that goes back to prehistoric times. A historian at heart, the area's rich ranching history is fascinating to Donna. She has also purposefully turned her own pain into a way to help others. Her autobiography, Cry the Darkness, has been printed in seven languages and is an audiobook and eBook in multiple countries. A fierce advocate for children's and women's rights, Donna serves on the U.S. Justice Department's Office for Crime Victims on its Technical Training Advisory Council and was nominated for the President's Service Award in 1996. Donna's career as an author has taken her and Ken all over the world. Bitten by the travel bug, she's been to all seven continents and multiple cities globally.

Closer to home, the Friesses have their own mini farm. An avid horseback rider and dog lover, Donna keeps three large quarter horse mares in the stables on the property, and she and Ken are both smitten with their three Golden Retrievers. Donna and the pups can be found walking down the San Juan Creek Trail most mornings, she rides her horses weekly, and often trots down to the Ortega Equestrian Center to say "howdy" to friends.

One of Donna and Ken's favorite memories together is centered around horses and riding. In 1974, their neighbor, John Clifton, organized a cross-country horse race for the people in their local community. Donna, new to riding, hadn't yet learned to use a saddle. Though she was up against horseshoers, serious cowboys, and other seasoned equestrians in town, Donna was not deterred.

Donna remembers, "The guys in town laughed when they found out I had entered the race. There was a purse for the winner and the runner-up. The course was daunting, starting in Hidden Valley, winding along the riverbed, and up the dirt on the side. Perhaps four miles in length, it was very dangerous; if a rider had fallen, they would have been trampled by the other horses on the narrow paths."

To the great shock of everyone in town, Donna came in first! And to sweeten the win, Ken was runner-up. That day, Donna learned she could go up against real cowboys and come out okay. And if she could do that, she could do anything.

Donna has parlayed her varied life experiences and lessons into helping others. She's been a grief counselor and a support system to countless individuals and now inspires others as a speaker and life coach. Ken volunteers as a girl's wrestling coach for San Clemente and Dana Hills high schools in his free time.

Though they have been married for nearly 60 years, their story is far from over. More in love today than ever, Donna and Ken Friess feel blessed to enjoy their "horsey and doggie San Juan life" together.





### Mead Me

he booze industry never tires of creating new options for consumers: cue wine coolers, Zimas, and now, seltzers. But let's jump in the way-back machine and discover a beverage that has existed for thousands of years.

Mead was the world's first fermented beverage, as determined by evidence recovered from ancient vessels in Asia, Europe, and Africa. It significantly predates any organized agricultural activity, as the ingredients to make mead don't require growing quantities of grain. Mead is essentially honey and water combined with yeast. The yeast in ancient times would be naturally occurring, requiring the honey and water mixture to be left in a place where it would be exposed to outside air.

The honey in mead provides the fermentable sugars versus the grains used for beer, grapes for wine, or almost anything with sugar content for distilled spirits. Often called "honey wine," mead can be infused with fruits, spices, and other flavorings. A mead with a fruit addition is referred to as a "melomel," and one with spices is a "metheglin." The most prevalent style of mead today is the "cyser," representing a blend of honey

and apple juice, which can be flavored in many ways. Depending on the style, mead can range in alcohol content from the low single digits all the way up to 18-22%.

If your curiosity is piqued and you want to discover this ancient beverage for yourself, it doesn't take an epic journey: You can go straight to the source at a meadery near you. (There are a handful within easy driving distance from Orange County.) Mead is also available from larger beverage retailers and often at places that specialize in craft beer.

Mead comes in many forms—still, sparkling, spiced, fruited, dry, and sweet. And because the ingredients used to make it are available worldwide, local versions have emerged from virtually every geography. Grab a cup of mead and venture into the past to enjoy the world's oldest fermented beverage.










